HENRY COUNTY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

MEETING MINUTES

AUGUST 6, 2020

I. CALL TO ORDER

A meeting of the Henry County Development Authority (HCDA) was held on August 6, 2020 at 125 Westridge Industrial Blvd., McDonough, Georgia. Board members present were Pierre Clements, David Linton and David Crow. Board members Reggie Sylvain and Eddie Ausband participated by conference call. Also in attendance were Rod Meadows, Legal Counsel, Josh Fenn, Executive Director, Leah Brown, Director Established Industry and Marketing, Jamal Lewis, Project Manager Business Development and Terry Collins, Recording Secretary. At 8:12 a.m., Chairman Clements called the meeting to order.

II. CALL ROLL/QUORUM/NOTICE OF MEETING

Chairman Clements asked for a roll call, which indicated the presence of a quorum, and verified that meeting notices were properly executed and posted.

III. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Chairman Clements asked if there were any changes or addition to the agenda as presented. Mr. Fenn requested that the first 3 items under New Business be moved to after Executive Session which would be required for the purpose of Real Estate and Personnel. Mr. Sylvain then made a motion to approve the agenda as amended and Mr. Crow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Clements asked if there were any questions or comments regarding the Minutes of July 9, 2020. Hearing none, Mr. Crow made a motion to approve the Minutes as presented and Mr. Linton seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

V. STANDING REPORTS

INVOICES/FINANCIALS/CORPUS

Mr. Fenn reviewed the HCDA Consolidated Report ending June 31, 2020 noting that spending is currently at only 1.8% of budget mostly due to less travel and meetings during this time. Most of the expenditures listed are standard operations. Board members and staff discussed the line item for the website refresh expenditure and Mr. Fenn will provide an updated report. With no further discussion, Mr. Linton made a motion to approve the Invoices, Financials and Corpus reports as presented. Mr. Sylvain seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Mr. Fenn paused for a moment for the Board to recognize Ms. Collins for 10 years of service to the Development Authority.

Board members were provided with a July 2020 Marketing Report, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. Ms. Brown reported that the kickoff for the HCDA website refresh and GIS Microsite tool would be next week. She discussed the continued outreach to established industries noting a lot of expansion

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projects. Ms. Brown reported good feedback from companies and that many are hiring. She noted that as companies share information regarding employment, the HCDA asks permission to share the information and assist in partnering the companies with Georgia Department of Labor. Mr. Fenn noted that over 1,000 jobs were announced with the last 2 project announcements.

DISTRICT REPORTS

District 1, 3 and 4 – no report

District 2 – Mr. Linton reported that a beautification project has begun at I-75 and Jonesboro Road.

District 5 – Mr. Clements reported that a beautification project has begun in the Fairview area.

VI. OLD BUSINESS

No Old Business to discuss.

VII. NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Fenn reviewed a sponsorship request from Southern Crescent Women in Business Funding Pitch 2020. Staff recommends sponsoring at the same level as last year which was \$500. After discussion, Mr. Sylvain made a motion to approve and Mr. Linton seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

VIII. LEGAL MATTERS

Mr. Meadows noted that he had no other legal matters outside of Executive Session.

IX. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Crow made a motion to move to Executive Session for the purpose of Real Estate and Personnel. Mr. Linton seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

RETURN TO OPEN SESSION

Mr. Meadows reviewed 2 sets of bonds for Project Purple. The first bond is for Project Purple Equipment. Mr. Meadows recommended the Chairman ask for a motion to 1) authorize the officers of the HCDA to sign documents as necessary to adopt an inducement resolution for Project Purple Equipment with attached Letter of Intent (LOI) for Project Purple; 2) authorize the officers of the HCDA to sign a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the company, the Development Authority and the Henry County Board of Assessors; and 3) adopt a resolution to sign the State offered REBA Grant documents a) Memorandum of Understanding for the REBA Grant and b) the Performance and Accountability Agreement for REBA Grant. Chairman Clements called for a motion authorizing the officers to sign documents as necessary to adopt the inducement resolution, LOI, MOA and REBA as stated by Counsel. Mr. Ausband made a motion to approve and Mr. Linton seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

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Mr. Meadows reviewed the second bond for Project Purple Real Estate and recommended the Chairman ask for a motion authorizing the officers of the HCDA to sign documents as necessary to adopt an inducement resolution with Letter of Intent and adopt the Memorandum of Agreement. Chairman Clements called for a motion for the officers of the HCDA to sign documents as necessary for the Real Estate Bond for Project Purple as stated by Counsel. Mr. Linton made a motion to approve and Mr. Crow seconded.

Mr. Meadows reviewed bond documents for Project Bear. At Mr. Meadows' recommendation, Chairman Clements asked for a motion for the officers of the HCDA to sign documents as necessary to adopt an inducement resolution with attached Letter of Intent and Memorandum of Agreement for Project Bear. Mr. Sylvain made a motion to approve and Mr. Linton seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Chairman Clements asked that if the Board is comfortable, to authorize the officers to sign documents as they are finalized, to move forward with State REBA Grant for Project Bear. Mr. Linton made a motion to approve and Mr. Crow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Fenn asked for Board approval to move forward with an incentive offer for Project Maple. Chairman Clements called for a motion. Mr. Crow made a motion to approve and Mr. Sylvain seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Fenn asked for Board approval to move forward with an incentive offer for Project Barbie. Chairman Clements called for a motion. Mr. Linton made a motion to approve and Mr. Crow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Fenn asked for Board approval to move forward with a contract with The Chason Group, once the contract is reviewed and approved by Counsel. Chairman Clements called for a motion. Mr. Crow made a motion to approve and Mr. Sylvain seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Fenn asked for Board approval for a contract for services with Leah Brown for completion of the HCDA website refresh. Chairman Clements called for a motion. Mr. Sylvain made a motion to approve and Mr. Crow seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

At this time, Chairman Clements recognized and thanked Ms. Leah Brown for her accomplishments and service to the Development Authority and presented her with an appreciation award. Ms. Brown will be leaving her position at the Development Authority.

X. ADJOURN

At 9:40 a.m., Mr. Crow made a motion to adjourn and Mr. Linton seconded. The motion passed unanimously.


